A Safe Environment - Triangle Day School is a safe place to be, physically, emotionally and intellectually.


STATEMENT OF DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION



ATHLETES.









At TDS, every student is known, valued, and loved. Understanding the importance of personal relationships and social-emotional skills, teachers create time and space for students to work together, support their classmates, and show care and concern for others. These opportunities extend beyond the classroom as well:

Crossroads - Students from TK through eighth grade are sorted into houses where they collaborate on activities throughout the year.

Buddies - Upper elementary students are paired with students in the primary grades. They meet weekly to enjoy stories, arts and crafts, games, and service projects.

Middle School Advisories - Sixth, seventh, and eighth graders begin and end each day meeting in small groups with their advisors.
